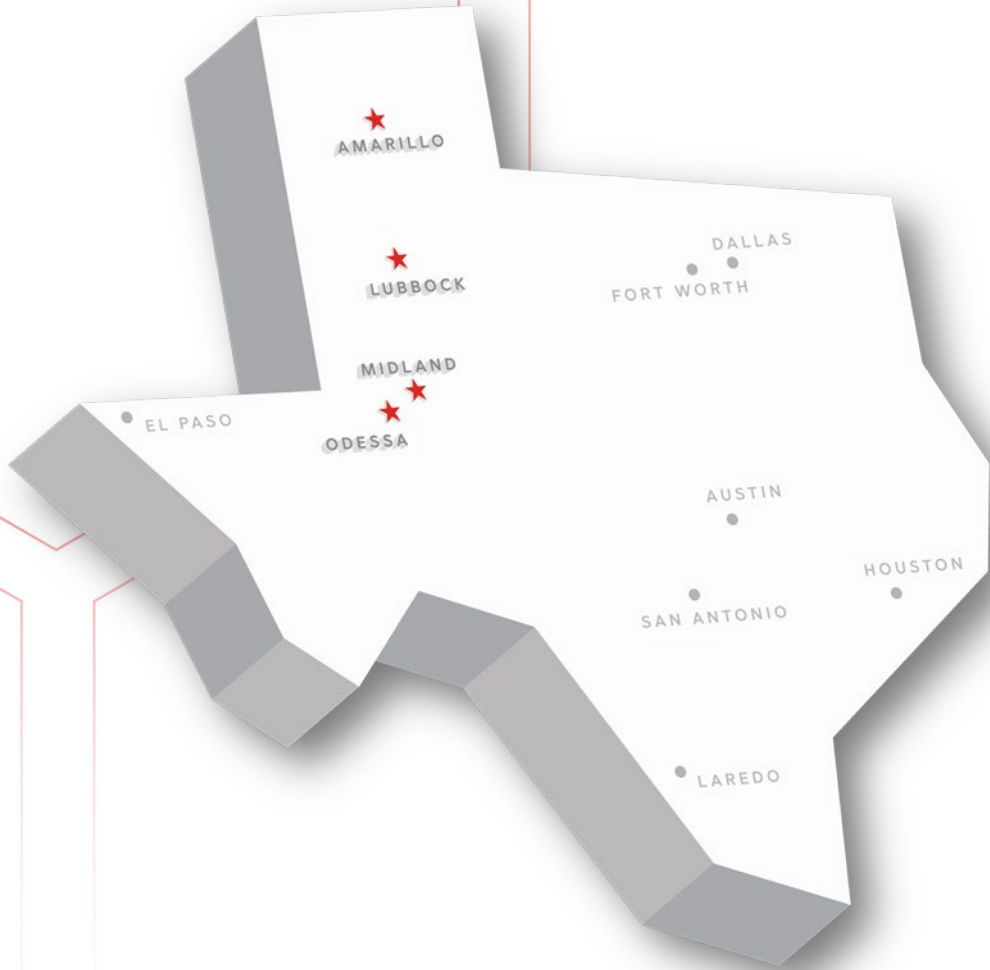

Typical Pathway

- 4 years of High School
 - 4 years of College
 - 4 years of Medical School
 - 3-5 year Residency
 - Potential Fellowship (specialize)
-
- In General:
 - What you learn in 1 year of High School = 1 semester in college
 - What you learn in 1 semester in college = 2 to 4 weeks in medical school

Multi-Campus System



- First 2 years spent in Lubbock, TX
- Years 3 & 4 are conducted in Lubbock, Amarillo, or Odessa
- You are given your campus assignment your first year for years 3 & 4

Joint Admissions Medical Program (JAMP)

- What is JAMP?
 - A special program created by the Texas Legislature to support and encourage highly qualified, economically disadvantaged Texas resident students pursuing a medical education
 - Partnership between 13 Texas medical schools and 68 public/private four-year undergraduate institutions
- What does JAMP provide?
 - Undergraduate scholarships and summer stipends
 - JAMP Summer Internship experiences
 - Comprehensive, multi-phase MCAT preparation program
 - Personal and professional development through mentoring
 - Guaranteed admission to a participating Texas medical school if all criteria are met
 - Scholarships to attend medical school

Future Healthcare Professionals Experiences (FHPE)

- What is FHPE?
 - Free event for high school and college students, college advisors, parents, and anyone interested in pursuing a health science related career.
 - Day event
 - Hosted by School of Medicine, School of Health Professions, School of Nursing, Graduate School of Biomedical Sciences, School of Pharmacy, School of Population and Public Health
- What is FHPE Jr.?
 - Similar event to FHPE but geared towards middle school students.

Premedical Enrichment Program (PEP)

- **What is PEP?**
 - 2-week camp for College Students
 - Geared for rising sophomores but open to all college students
 - Preparation for applying to medical school
 - Experiences
 - Clinical and shadowing experiences
 - Anatomy
 - Professional development
 - Mock interviews
 - Competitive applicant

Premedical Enrichment Program (PEP)

- **Program Requirements**

- Be a Texas resident and have attended a Texas high school
- Minimum GPA of 3.25 on a 4.0 scale
- Minimum SAT score of 1010 or minimum ACT score of 20
- Have an interest in primary care medicine or rural health medicine
- At least one letter of evaluation
 - Preferably from a current or past professor or faculty member

- **Application**

- January 15th (tentative) – April 1st

- **Program Dates**

- TBA (usually the first two weeks of June)



Early Dedication to Medical Education (EDME)

- What is EDME?
 - Outreach program designed to expose individuals to the possibility of a career in medicine
 - Anyone interested in becoming a physician can attend
 - Sessions hosted monthly throughout academic year
 - Topics include:
 - Specialty Roundtables
 - Surgery
 - Emergency Medicine
 - Pediatrics
 - DNA Day

Early Acceptance Program (EAP)



• Early Acceptance Programs – EAP

- Apply between sophomore and junior year of college
- Must attend participating schools
 - Texas Tech University
 - Lubbock Christian University
 - Angelo State University
 - Austin College
 - West Texas A&M University
 - Abilene Christian University
 - University of Texas Permian Basin
- NOT an accelerated program

Early Acceptance Program

- Primary Qualifications
 - Texas Residents
 - Graduated from a Texas high school
 - U.S. Citizen or Permanent Resident
 - Minimum score of 1360 on SAT or a 30 on the ACT upon matriculation from high school
 - Superscores not accepted
- Timeline
 - May 1: TMDSAS application opens
 - October: TMDSAS application closes
 - December – January: Interviews
 - February – April: Admission decisions given via email
